

WHAT WE

Safe Families Schools is an evidence-based program, created in response to the urgent need for early intervention to keep children safe and families together. We work alongside schools and early childhood centers to identify and establish a parent and child safety network for isolated families enduring hardship and unforeseeable challenges. By standing in the gap, we offer relational and resource support to help stabilize and strengthen parents and prevent family separation.



OUR ()BJectiles

Our goal is to connect vulnerable families in the early childhood and elementary school settings to a network of caring and supportive volunteers in order to positively impact a child's ability to learn, grow and thrive. The average age of a child in foster care is <u>8 years old</u>.* Educators and school administrators are the primary source for early identification of children and families in crisis. In partnership with local schools and early childhood centers, we recruit and activate a support network within the community to:

Stabilize, strengthen + support parents

Minimize or eliminate harmful disruptions for a child at school

Enhance a child's learning, development + growth

Reduce family stressors + isolation

HOW IT WORKS

Safe Families for Children is fueled by radical hospitality, disruptive generosity, and intentional compassion. We aim to strengthen parents, prevent child abuse and neglect, and reduce family separation by deflecting children from unnecessarily entering foster care.

Our evidence-based movement partners with local communities to recruit, train and equip volunteers through Circles of Support to serve families facing significant life stressors. Each role assists in stabilizing and strengthening the family unit through building intentional relationships to prevent future isolation.

- Provided 1.4 million bed nights of safety for children
